Sharon Pace Arnold ~ President

Sharon's grandfather came to Truckee in 1889 from Italy. A shoemaker by trade, he operated a business on the on the corner of Church and Bridge Streets. Tony Pace, Sharon's father, operated the Truckee Mercantile from 1944 to 1968. Her mother, Jeanne, was born in Gilroy, California and came to Truckee in 1935 as a relief telephone operator during summer months while residing at Bob & Annie Tonini's residence on River Street. Tony and Jeanne met in 1935 and were soon married.

Sharon attended Truckee Grammar School when it was located in Today's Recreation building on Church Street. She was a member of the first freshman class at the new Tahoe-Truckee High School in 1951. Thereafter, she attended San Jose State University and San Francisco Dental Nurses Training School and worked for a dentist until 1961. While working in the Bay area, Sharon met her husband Bud, a fifth generation San Franciscan and the couple were married in 1961. They lived and worked in Santa Rosa for 17 years, then went to Florida in 1980 where they lived on a boat for a year.

From 1981 through 1987 they lived in San Rafael where Sharon worked for a computer chip manufacturer until 1987. They then relocated to Folsom where she worked for in the electronic business from 1987 to 1991. Returning to Truckee in 1991, Sharon has been active community, working with the town of Truckee in drafting the Downtown Specific Plan for 3 years, serving in the Historic Preservation Council, and as Trustee of the Cemetery

Garden Dedication


The Community Memorial Garden is to honor all people who called Truckee their home, early day pioneers, servicemen and women, and

citizens who have aided the community in its development, dedicated May 27, 2001 by the Truckee Donner Historical Society, Inc... The language on this plaque states the purpose of the Community Memorial Garden.

Many of you knew Thelma Finger Meiss and she was a dedicated and loyal supporter of all activities of TDHS. But her special joy was being a docent at the Old Jail Museum. She loved talking with people from all around the world who have visited our little museum; but her special joy was giving tours to the many school groups that come on an annual basis. Thelma passed away May 2, 2000 at the age of 94. Thelma was a gardener and just before she passed away I asked her if she would approve of a memorial garden in her honor and for all those who called Truckee their home. She and her family agreed and I volunteered to chair this project and the garden fundraising was immediately put into place after her passing. I, and a small crew of 27 volinteers commenced our work after the Town of Truckee graciously loaned a backhoe, and operator, and tons of granite that form the memorial wall and various parts of retaining walls and walkways.; I extend my personal thanks to all those who helped on this project: Tom Covey, Eric Larusson, Shirley Knapp, Winnie Wain, Bernie Lander, Chelsea Walterscheid, Steve Harris, Rich Griese, Barbara Barte-Osborn, Dave Corollo, Allie Hahn, Jim Hirst, Peggy Boelk, Lindy Astrup, Joy Horn, Guy Coates, Barbara Sullivan, Jeri McElhaney, Heather Hudson and Don Colclough. I let the photos speak a thousand words. Special donations were made by the Sierra Tinkerbells Garden Club, Villager Nursery, Trout Creek Landscape and The Rock Garden, along with Tahoe Instant Press and the Sierra Sun.


