Revision to Hilltop Master Plan

The Truckee Donner Historical Society submitted a request to the Town Planning Commission to expand the current Master Plan regarding the Cultural Resources portion of the Environmental

Policies. As written, the Hilltop Master plan provides for a comprehensive historic interpretation program to identify and describe how historic characters, events, and themes were significant to the Hilltop area. The Historical Society submitted a letter requesting the policy be expanded to include "with guidance provided by the Truckee Donner Historical Society". Also included was a request for a "central location or focal point in the form of a covered or enclosed kiosk building, created and maintained by the developer so that ongoing interpretation of this history can be provided by the Historical Society and/or other community historical organizations."

The language in our suggestions was accepted by the Developer and adopted in the Planning Commission's recommended modifications to the Master Plan.

This addition is in keeping with the Truckee Donner Historical Society's overall goal to continue to preserve and educate the community and our visitors about our history. An opportunity to provide rotational displays and human interaction allows for a more rich and comprehensive understanding of the importance and value of the history of Truckee on this site and the contribution to the development of recreational winter sports in the Sierra.

Lynda is donating her efforts to the Society so we can include this information in our research library and if all goes as planned, to be made available on our website for other researchers and genealogist to obtain easy access to the halls of Truckee history.

We are approaching the time to elect the officers for the 2008-2009 term. Last year the membership voted overwhelmingly to change the Constitution to allow for a vote by mail option.


