The building is also used as a meeting place for the Truckee Cemetery District, the Chief Truckee Chapter of the E Clampus Vitus and the Nevada County Landmarks Commission.

### ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP REPORT From the SEPTEMBER 27, 2005 Annual Election Dinner

The new memberships are keeping pace with members we are losing thereby keeping our total membership totals exactly the same. A repeat of last year.

The chart below shows the number count for our membership types. A recap of the changes are:
